THE HISTORY OF ULBS

Lucian Blaga University of Sibiu stands as a testament to the rich educational heritage of Sibiu, a city with academic traditions dating back to the **14th** century. The formal inception of ULBS occurred in 1990, evolving from earlier educational institutions and reflecting a commitment to academic excellence.

The university's name honors Lucian Blaga, a renowned Romanian philosopher and poet, who had significant ties to Sibiu during the 1940s. ULBS encompasses nine faculties, offering a diverse array of programs that cater to a broad spectrum of academic interests.

Today, it serves as a dynamic center for learning, research, and cultural development in Romania and beyond - with 81 Bachelor's programs, 58 Master's programs, 16 Ph.D. fields, 1 Romanian Preparatory Year and 2 modules for Erasmus+ students.

With a diverse range of undergraduate, master's. and doctoral programs, **English** including several taught programs, ULBS prepares students for success in a globalized world. THE HISTORY OF SIBIU


Sibiu. one of Romania's most picturesque cities, boasts a rich history that dates back to medieval times. It was founded by Saxon settlers in the 12th century as part of a fortified system along the borders of the Holy Roman Empire. Over the centuries, Sibiu flourished as a cultural and economic hub, particularly during the 14th and 15th centuries, when it became a major center of trade and education. In the 18th century, it served as the capital of Transylvania for a brief period, solidifying its importance in the region.

Today, Sibiu is celebrated for its well-preserved medieval architecture, including the famous **Brukenthal Palace** and the **Lutheran Cathedral**, which attract tourists from around the world.

The city's culture is a vibrant blend of its Saxon heritage and Romanian traditions, creating a unique atmosphere that is both cosmopolitan and deeply rooted in history.

Modern Sibiu is known for its cultural events, such as the **Sibiu International Theatre Festival** and **Sibiu Jazz Festival**, which draw international artists and visitors.

The city maintains a lively student population, an artistic community, and a warm, welcoming atmosphere that balances historical pride with progressive ideas, making it one of Romania's most dynamic and culturally rich cities.



VISA & RESIDENCE PERMIT

- If you require a visa, apply in advance at the Romanian embassy in your country.
- After arrival, international students must apply for a residence permit at the Immigration Office in Sibiu.

CURRENCY & BANKING

- The local currency is the Romanian Leu (RON/LEI).
- 1 EUR \approx 5 RON (exchange rates may vary).
- It is best to exchange money at official exchange offices or banks.
- Opening a Romanian bank account is recommended for easier transactions.
- Recommended banks: ING Bank, Banca Transilvania, Raiffeisen Bank, BCR, BRD

ELECTRICITY & PLUGS

- Romania uses Type F plugs (European standard) with a voltage of 230V and a frequency of 50Hz.
- You may need a plug adapter if your country uses a different type.







ACCOMMODATION

University Dorms

- Affordable option: 500-1000 RON per month.
- Shared rooms, basic facilities, and a student-friendly environment.

Renting an Apartment

- Costs: 1,200 2,500 RON per month (depending on size and location).
- Recommended neighborhoods: Center, Hipodrom, Vasile Aaron.
- Websites for finding rentals: OLX.ro, Storia.ro, or Facebook groups.

GENERAL COSTS OF LIVING

- **Groceries:** ~600-900 RON/month
- Eating out: Budget meal ~25-40 RON,

Restaurant meal ~60-120 RON

- Gym membership: ~200 RON/month
- Mobile data & Internet: ~30-60 RON/month
- Cinema ticket: 30-50 RON

- Affordable: Lidl, Penny, Profi
- Wide variety: Carrefour, Auchan, Kaufland

TRANSPORTATION IN SIBIU

Public Transport:

- Sibiu has a well-connected bus system that is easy to use. Tickets can be bought from kiosks, onboard from the driver, or using a mobile app.
- Make sure to validate your ticket by stamping it at a ticket machine before you board the bus.
- You can also get a monthly transport pass if you plan to use buses often.
- A monthly student bus pass is covered by the University. Please contact your Faculty secretary's office for more information.

Walking and Cycling:

- Sibiu is a relatively small city, so walking and cycling are great options to get around.
- Sustainable transportation options are available, and there are many bike paths and pedestrian-friendly areas, especially in the city center.

Taxis and Ride-Sharing:

- Taxis are available, but it is recommended to use ride-sharing apps like **Uber** or **Bolt**, which are more commonly used in Sibiu.
- Taxi tip: always make sure the meter is running to avoid overcharging.

HEALTH & SAFETY





HEALTH INSURANCE

- If you are an **EU student**, you can use your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) for medical services in Romania.
- **Non-EU students** will need to get health insurance either through their university or privately. Check with your university about the options available.
- ULBS students can benefit from free medical services provided by the Student Medical Office.

HOSPITALS

- Public hospitals: Sibiu County Hospital
- Private hospitals: Regina Maria, MedLife Polisano Hospital
- Health insurance is required; check if your country has an agreement with Romania.

EMERGENCY NUMBERS

• 112 is the emergency number for police, fire, or medical emergencies.

PHARMACIES

• Pharmacies are widely available, and most of them have English-speaking staff. If you need medication, ask for a "farmacie".

SIM CARD, WIFI & INTERNET



SIM CARD

- Major providers: Orange, Vodafone, Digi, Telekom.
- Prepaid SIM cards are available at supermarkets and mobile shops.
- Monthly plans range from 30-60 RON, offering unlimited calls and mobile data.

WIFI & INTERNET

- You can access the University's Eduroam network using the same credentials as your home University.
- Free WiFi is available in most cafés, restaurants, and public areas.



UNIVERSITY CANTEEN

Canteen Operating Hours:

Monday to Friday, 12:00 PM - 3:30 PM.

Payment Methods:

Payments can be made using a bank card or cash.

Food services within the Faculty:

Vending machines stocked with snacks, sandwiches, and coffee are available in all university faculties.

Pricing:

The canteen is known for its affordable prices. For instance, a meal comprising a main course, side dish, and dessert is priced around **25-30 RON**.

Quality and Sourcing:

The canteen emphasizes using fresh ingredients, sourcing produce from local suppliers.

Accessibility:

Access to the canteen requires a **student card**.

Regarding dormitory applications:


International students must apply through the online platform for a place in the dormitory.
